Primary Job Responsibilities:

- 1. Planning, supervising, and implementing developmentally appropriate curriculum in accordance with the philosophy of Brookside School:
 - a. Attend all team planning meetings
 - b. Prepare a daily, well-planned environment with appropriate, meaningful, and engaging activities which stimulate children's involvement and learning
 - c. Facilitate children's learning and play in a non-directive, positive, and flexible manner, knowing when and how to step in, shift gears, and adapt activities to promote cognitive and social growth
 - d. Establish and maintain a print rich environment, varied socio-dramatic and sensorimotor opportunities, with activities to foster learning in math, literacy, science, social studies, music, and art
 - e. Help children become aware of their roles as integral members of a group
- 2. Gearing the program, expectations, and responses to the needs of individual children and families for their interests, backgrounds, abilities, and individual style and pace of learning:
 - a. Treating all children and their families with dignity and respect, maintaining positive discipline through the use of nonjudgmental language and tone of voice
 - b. Sharing responsibility for the ordered arrangement of the learning environment, arrival, dismissal, snack, lunch, and playground supervision
 - c. Assessing children, conducting parent/teacher conferences, preparing progress reports and providing parents with regular classroom updates
 - d. Maintaining open and positive communication among team members
