The Trades Helper position is primarily responsible for assisting the Skilled Trades and for performing semi-skilled work associated with basic trades operations. This position is viewed as an apprentice.

Responsibilities include, but are not limited to: Responsible for bringing necessary supplies to the job site; assists in unloading trucks, etc.; helps set up ladders, scaffolding, and other necessary equipment; performs miscellaneous duties for Skilled Trades as necessary during a job; assist in surface preparation, plastering, and repair of holes; assist in material application; assist in furniture covering and masking; assist with installation, maintenance, and repair of various window treatments; works with historically significant and unique Art and Leaded Glass; may assist or work with specialized contracted glaziers; may estimate time, labor, and materials required to complete a job; tests and maintains all smoke and heat detectors and reporting devices in accordance to applicable codes and requirements under direct supervision of the electronic supervisor; assists with the resetting of alarm systems as required; provides support to assist in the needs of the Public Safety Department with programming of new security codes, deleting users, etc.; assists with the repair of radios for all Facilities and Public Safety operations; assists with the maintenance of synchronized clocks on campus; assists the Electrical and Information Tech Departments as assigned; must be aware of proper procedures to use when encountering suspected asbestos containing material to avoid personal exposure, contamination of job site, and exposure of facility occupants to asbestos; maintains a clean working environment and cleans up job site after work is completed; other duties as assigned.

Requirements: High School diploma or GED; on the job training in Skilled and Semi-Skilled trades, as required of an apprentice; demonstrated ability to operate tools and equipment safely; knowledge of paint materials applications; ability to prepare surfaces for materials applications; some experience in electronic repairs is desirable; ability to learn and become certified in electronics, electrical, carpentry, H.V.A.C. or plumbing with the State of Michigan; ability to learn and achieve journeyman apprentice level in paint application, window glazing, masonry, or plaster application; ability to understand technical direction; willing to dedicate personal time for training as outlined in the tuition reimbursement program; valid Michigan driver's license with satisfactory driving record.

Shift is Monday – Friday 7:30 am – 4:00 pm; pay rate is \$17.67 per hour.
